



Brian Delauter was named General Manager of General Aviation (GA) in September 2009.

In this position, Mr. Delauter continues to use his extensive GA experience in government and private industry to lead the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA) strategy to enhance security within the GA sector, while reducing the risk of the misuse of GA assets by developing identification capabilities, including positive pilot and aircraft identification.

Mr. Delauter has an extensive GA background and expertise, including corporate and recreational aircraft operations, airports, airspace, and airmen issues.

Mr. Delauter joined TSA in 2002, as a stakeholder liaison, and in 2006, he was appointed Assistant Federal Security Director at Jacksonville International Airport. In 2007, he was named Federal Security Director at Savannah International Airport where he was responsible for all TSA activities at nine airports across two states.

Prior to joining TSA, Mr. Delauter spent more than 15 years in the aviation community as a GA pilot, including flight instruction, and a standards Captain for Netjets. Brian left GA to fly commercially with Northwest Airlines as First Officer on the DC-9 and Airbus A320. He currently holds multiple Federal Aviation Administration licenses, including Commercial Single Engine Land, Commercial Multi Engine Land, Airline Transport Pilot, and Flight Instructor (Single Engine, Multi Engine, and Instrument) as well as three jet type ratings.

Mr. Delauter began his career as a flight instructor at Elgin Air Force Base in Florida and holds a bachelor of science degree in aviation management from the Florida Institute of Technology. Brian is a graduate of the Federal Executive Institute and is a member of the Senior Executive Service.
