Don Champion is a leader with vision, integrity, and a passion for aviation. His life-long dedication and passion for aviation is evident at Banyan Air Service, an 85-acre aviation complex at Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport.

Don was born a missionary kid in Nigeria, West Africa and routinely flew aboard Cessna and Piper aircraft to attend classes at a Protestant American boarding school. Flying in these aircraft started his life-time passion for aviation.

At Seneca College, in Toronto, Canada, Don participated in a four-year aviation course which also included a commercial, multi-engine pilot's license and one year of aircraft maintenance. In 1979, he moved to South Florida and worked as a co-pilot for a small charter operation flying primarily to the Bahamas.

As a charter pilot, he quickly realized there was an opportunity for a maintenance facility to service the aircraft he was flying and that of other similar charter companies. With one small hangar, one friend, and two employees, he began Banyan Air Service at Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport to service these aircraft.

Banyan once a small maintenance facility, now has 150 teammates and has grown to become an internationally recognized full-service FBO with a multitude of services available in one location; including, turbine airframe and engine maintenance, avionics service and installations, aircraft sales and management, parts sales and distribution, Hangar63 (Banyan's Aviation Store), and TropicAero.com (Banyan's catalog and on-line store division). The Banyan Complex is also home to flight schools, charter operators, air ambulance, a helicopter maintenance shop and property managers.

Don's entrepreneurial spirit allows him to continually visualize and improve services for the aviation community. A few of his many achievements include:
